

Minutes: General Membership Meeting of February 5, 2019

Prior to the meeting we listened to a 60-second ad recorded by Dinosaur Radio promoting the first weekend of Syracuse Winterfest.

The meeting was called to order at 6:11pm by President Bill Cooper at San Miguel Mexican Restaurante.

No corrections were noted to the January meeting minutes; a motion was made by Don Goulet, seconded by Yvonne Russell, and the minutes were approved by the membership. Treasurer Ann Goehner reported balances as of December 31st as Checking: \$15,673.21 and Investment: \$228,261.49. There were no guests or new members in attendance.

Under Programs, Bill Cooper updated members regarding UDT sponsored Winterfest events: Chili Cook-off has 11 places entered, Chowder has 4. There are 13 restaurants entered in the Wing Walk, the most ever for the event; the only place we are certain that needs volunteers is Syracuse Suds Factory.

Special Events Director Diane Knowlton reported upcoming volunteer opportunities: Irish Road Bowling in Onondaga Lake Park on Sunday, March 17th, American Heart Walk on March 23rd at SRC Arena on OCC campus, and Earth Day Clean-Up at several locations around downtown Syracuse on April 27th.

In Membership, the Meet Out/Eat dates for February are the 6th at PressRoom Pub downtown, the 11th at Avicolli's in Liverpool, the 20th at Denny's at Lawrence Rd. in North Syracuse, and the 26th at Flaming Grill in Northern Lights Plaza. The Iron Chef cooking competition will be scheduled for sometime in the spring. In Sunshine, Diane left a sympathy card from the UDT at the calling hours for former member Dick Wallace.

Under Public Relations, mention was made of the audio spot heard before the meeting; there will be others to run through the end of Winterfest. The new UDT brochures will be completed soon. The Syracuse Winterfest website has been updated and the UDT one will be worked on soon.

Redhouse Arts Center Announces 2019-2020 Season

Inaugural season from Broadway-credited Hunter Foster

The 2019-2020 season of the Redhouse Arts Center was announced earlier this week, and features performances focused around the idea of family. The season is the first from the Redhouse's new artistic director, Hunter Foster, who boasts Broadway credits, including originating the role of Bobby Strong in Urinetown. Foster fell in love with the Redhouse's new building and the freedom that the space presented. He hopes to use the space to create an "immersive theater experience." His goal is for the audience to feel the show start the moment they walk through the doors. Next season's line-up reflects themes and names of shows that were consistent with the history of shows that the Redhouse has performed; it's also consistent with requests from the community. ground floor featuring e a grocery store component, cafe, bar and more! The second floor of the building will be offices for the Allyn Family Foundation and other not-for-profits. The top three floors will be home to 37 mixed income apartments, ranging from low income to market-rate.

The food hall will expand on the momentum of the revitalization of Downtown Syracuse, offering opportunities for entrepreneurial vendors to start and build their businesses. Collaborative office space will be designed, encouraging partnerships among community organizations.
