

No corrections were noted to the March meeting minutes; a motion was made by Dave Osborn, seconded by Yvonne Russell, and the minutes were approved by the membership. Special Events Director Diane Knowlton reported the following volunteer opportunities: Earth Day Clean-up (with various locations having separate start times) and The Syracuse Heart Walk at SRC Arena at OCC both on Saturday April 21st, Mountain Goat run on Sunday, May 6th, and the Downtown Living Tour on Saturday, May 19th. Downtown Living Tour Previews



Iron Pier Apartments

720 Van Rennselaer Street

Located just a half-mile from Downtown

Syracuse, a new, urban neighborhood is coming soon to the city's Inner Harbor. When construction is complete, the Iron Pier Apartments will be home to more than 400 residential opportunities, including apartments, townhouses and condominiums. The Iron Pier Apartments are now leasing for a projected October 2018 move-in. Each unit offers convenient features designed for waterfront living. 2018 Living Tour attendees are invited to rest their legs and enjoy appetizers and drinks in the **W XYZ Bar & Lounge** in the Aloft Syracuse Inner Harbor Hotel, which is the Official Rest Stop for the Downtown Living Tour!



Oak Knitting Mill 102 W. Division Street

The Oak Knitting Mill Apartments - designed by famed Syracuse architect Archimedes Russell - was one of the first industrial buildings established on the reclaimed salt flats in the neighborhood now known as Franklin Square, and one of the most recent industrial buildings to be re-developed in this vicinity in the present-day. Its name is a tribute to its history, and a symbol of the fabric *literally* woven through its story. The building was first home to the Oak Knitting Company, which produced women's knit underwear until it moved to Atlanta in 1927. The historic mill has been converted into 38 high-end residential units, blending modern amenities and

finishes with character and charms from its storied past. The Oak Knitting Mill Apartments is a National Parks Service certified rehabilitation project.

239 East Water Street 239 East Water Street

Set in historic Hanover Square - the oldest neighborhood in the City of Syracuse - 239 East Water Street is the newest project by the design team of Urban Realty Group and R.F. Esposito. Two loft units are planned, which will include many of the unique modern amenities faithful tour-goers may remember from the Lofts at 235, seen on the 2017 Downtown Living Tour (pictured right).





GrangeX 203 East Water Street

GrangeX is a \$3.4 million expansion of the Historic Grange Building renovation project completed in 2012. Scheduled for completion in July 2018, GrangeX will feature nine executive apartment homes, including three flats and six townhouse style units with private balconies. Together, GrangeX and the Historic Grange will contain a total of 12 executive apartment homes and include private onsite parking. Designed by Open Atelier Architects, the GrangeX units have an edgy and contemporary feel that is sure to appeal to a diverse population. Located in the heart of the Historic Hanover Square district, the combined property is the perfect fit for empty nesters and/or business executives seeking the charm and excitement of downtown living.

State Tower 109 South Warren Street

The 2018 Downtown Living Tour begins at State Tower, located in the Hanover Square Historic District. State Tower is the pinnacle of city living. The building is home to a mix of studio, one-bedroom and two-bedroom apartments. Each unit features a unique floor plan, delivering stunning vistas, modern layouts and deluxe amenities.

When the State Tower building was first established, it was marketed for office space. Recently, Pioneer Companies completed a nearly \$40 million restoration to give the building new life as "State Tower." The extensive project included repairs to the building's masonry facade (which recently won a prestigious award - read more about that below), as well as significant structural and system upgrades. Standing 22 stories and 315 feet tall, State Tower offers unparalleled views and still holds the distinction of being the tallest building in Central New York. The Art Deco design by architects Thompson and Churchill set a precedent for buildings that followed, including New York City's Chrysler Building (est. 1928) and the Empire State Building (est. 1930), and the motif is still carried throughout the building today.





PressRoom Pub Now Open 220 Herald Place

The PressRoom Pub is now open! Located at 220 Herald Place, the pub & restaurant is open Monday – Sunday, 11am to midnight. The decor at the PressRoom Pub pays homage to history and sports. The tables and bars are made from an old basketball court, and there are arcade games and a 21-foot shuffle board. The menu is crafted to read like a newspaper, paying tribute to the building's previous tenant, the Herald Journal. The "daily scoup" section will list the soups of the day, and the "weather report" will list that day's specials. The menu features classic pub fare, including pizza, wings, sandwiches and burgers, including the promised nine-ounce burger!

Opening Soon: The Ice Cream Stand

The Ice Cream Stand is expected to open in The Amos Building right by Clinton Square on West Water Street - and it will be open year-round! The Ice Cream Stand will also serve coffee and other hot beverages. Owner Amanda Hughes plans to feature live music this summer and says the shop will also eventually serve alcohol. The Ice Cream Stand has closed its location on Taft Road in North Syracuse to move to Downtown Syracuse!
