

Those gathered enjoyed the refreshments before the meeting (6:00 - 6:15pm).

The meeting was called to order at 6:15pm by President Bill Cooper.

No corrections were noted to the August meeting minutes; a motion was made by Don Goulet, seconded by Dave Osborn, and the minutes were approved by the membership. Treasurer Ann Goehner reported balances as of July 31st as Checking: \$ and Investment: \$. There were no new members or guests in attendance tonight.

Vice President Don Goulet had nothing new to report.

Under Public Relations: The owner of the Winds of Cold Springs Harbor Marina Tiki Bar wants to know soon if we want to be the stage sponsor in 2018; we should investigate other bar stages as well; maybe do more than one. We also need to keep alter for opportunities to be naming or co-sponsors that are produced by another entity, perhaps not-for-profit group.

The Stoop Kitchen to Open on October 4

Featuring Bakery, Retail Space, Large Dining Area and Two Bar Areas



The new and improved Stoop Kitchen will open its doors on Wednesday, October 4 serving lunch, dinner, and Sunday Brunch. There will also be a coffee bar & bakery, as well as two bars (one downstairs, and one upstairs) to serve patrons. It was important to owner Eric Alderman and new partner, Abigail Henson (who ran LoFo in Armory Square from 2012-2016) to maintain the character and charm of the 2nd floor that previous customers may remember from the 90s & early 2000s, but they wanted to add exciting new elements to the first floor.

The dinner menu will change every six weeks or so. The majority of featured items will feature ingredients grown or produced locally and regionally. Eventually, as a nod to the restaurant's name and logo, pigeon will also make its way to the menu as well.

Though hours may vary in different areas of the restaurant, the space will be open Wednesday through Sunday. Reservations are recommended, but not required and can be made on the website or through Open Table. Please note, The Stoop Kitchen will be closed on Mondays and Tuesdays (to give staff two days off each week), but the space will be open for organizations to meet or hold events on those days.

16 New Apartments and Speakeasy Planned



\$4.2 million project planned

New apartments are planned for the upper floors of the buildings on South Salina Street known as the "Twin Sisters." A group of developers - Ryan Benz, Leigh Ann Boatman-Benz, Steve Case and Dr. Shashank Bhatt - want to create 16 new apartments on the upper floors of 321 South Salina Street and 323 South Salina Street. The apartments will be named Whitney Lofts. A main lobby would be located on the Bank Alley side of the buildings (which runs behind the buildings), with an entrance planned for South Salina Street as well. The buildings have played host to several retailers and manufacturers over the years, including the park Brannock Shoe Store, where the Brannock shoe-measuring device was invented. Most recently, 321 South Salina Street was home to a variety store, while 323 South Salina Street was the home of Lee's Express, a Chinese restaurant. The developers hope to restore the exterior of the building to its original Italianate Style facade featuring large windows, which were covered up in the 1960s. There are plans to bring a speakeasy and a restaurant to the ground floor, which sprawls across 5,500 square feet.
