

# Restaurant, Speakeasy & Apartments Expected to be Ready by End of Year

The community is learning more about the restaurant and 1920s speakeasy-style bar that will occupy the ground-floor and basement space of The Whitney Lofts, located at 321-323 South Salina Street. The restaurant will be called "Oh My Darling" and take up the first floor of the Whitney Lofts building. The American restaurant will offer full table service for dinner, as well as a lunch menu. The lunch crowd will also have an option to find grab-and-go items including paninis, pastas, salads and sandwiches, within a smaller section in the restaurant called "Clementine." Selections in both places will feature offerings from local farms.

In the basement, a speakeasy called "The Fitz" - named in honor of Ella Fitzgerald - will open at 5pm

every evening, featuring live music played on a baby grand piano. Partners in the project hope "The Fitz" will become the pre- and post-show destination for Landmark Theatre event attendees. There will be unique cocktails and elixirs themed around performances taking place at the venue, located just across the street. The new restaurant and speakeasy are expected to be open by the end of the year.

Additionally, plans also call for 12 one-bedroom and four two-bedroom apartments on the floors above. Characteristics such as refinished hardwood floors, original tin ceilings and brick archways will serve as a nod to the 1920s, complete with modern high-end finishes. Those are also expected to be ready by the end of the year.



#### Coming Soon: A Mano Kitchen & Bar

A Mano Kitchen & Bar, a new Italian restaurant, plans to open in Icon Tower this September. Most of the menu is priced at under \$20, with the idea that patrons will order several dishes to share. # New Business: Talisman Tap Room

The Talisman Tap Room is now open in the space most recently occupied by J. Ryan's, and much of the iconic bar still remains, plus an improved menu. The Talisman Tap Room will continue to offer pub food such as burgers and garbage plates, with the addition of "elevated pub food" options including poutine, Scotch eggs, nachos, chicken and waffles, fish and chips, pot pies and much more!
