

Minutes: General Membership Meeting of November 5, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:01pm by President Bill Cooper.

No corrections were noted to the October meeting minutes; a motion was made by Yvonne Russell, seconded by Don Goulet, and the minutes were approved by the membership. No guests or new members were in attendance.

Treasurer Ann Goehner reported balances as of September 30th: Checking and Investment

For Board Elections, agreeing to continue in their current positions were Don Goulet as Vice President & Ann Goehner as Treasurer. Approved was a motion made by Len Kolakowski and seconded by Dave Osborn, to record one vote for each signifying unanimous reelection by the membership. The Programs and Public Relations Director positions remain open.

In Programs, Len spoke about plans for the UDT 40th anniversary and showed what has been developed for a revised UDT logo to include "Celebrating 40 Years". He & Ann will meet again on Thursday to work out a proposed budget for review at the November Board meeting. Syracuse Winterfest has gotten the go ahead from the Marriott to stage fireworks from the roof of the hotel's garage on South Warren Street and the UDT are considering sponsoring them as a kickoff to our anniversary year. More discussion was had about PIP in 2020 and how that could be implemented.

Under Membership, the Meet Out/Eat dates for November were as noted in the newsletter: on the 9th, 10th, 23rd and 26th. Bill will host the annual Cookie Exchange on Sunday, December 8th, 2pm – 6pm. Under Sunshine, Diane dropped off a card for former member Yvonne Hooker who broke her foot.


Window Wonderland Contest:

Wildflowers Armory Opens in New Location


Located at 217 S. Salina Street

There's a new speakeasy in Armory Square, but you need to be "in the know" to find out where it is and how to get in! Visit the Gilded Club's website or Facebook page to get clues about the location, then crack the access code on social media, or simply buy it for \$1. Limited access codes are available each day, and new codes are issued on Mondays. Once inside, guests will enjoy sophisticated cocktails, wine, beer and select food items. The nightclub is decorated with an old-fashioned flare, but guests can still enjoy modern amenities such as TVs, music and board games.



The Gilded Club is open from 8:00 pm to 2:00 am Wednesday through Sunday, and from 6pm to 2am Thursday - Saturday. The nightclub is closed Sunday - Tuesday.

Tech Garden Expansion Announced

Plans include a two-story addition; enhanced streetscapes for Downtown corridor

Gov. Cuomo recently announced plans for a two-story expansion of The Tech Garden, a business incubator designed to help technology start-up companies. Located at the corner of South Warren and Harrison streets, The Tech Garden will add 46,000 sq. ft. of incubation and acceleration space. The addition will create new space for companies to establish offices, as well as open new opportunities for more start-up companies and entrepreneurs to move in. The new addition will also feature an indoor "Drone Zone," an incubation area for UAS companies. New York State is

contributing \$12.5 million to the expansion, which is expected to be complete in 2021.

Affordable Apartments Planned for Historic Smith Restaurant Supply Building



Construction expected to start Summer 2020

Plans were announced earlier this year to bring 37 affordable apartments to the historic Smith Restaurant Supply Building, at the corner of S. Townsend and E. Water Streets. The project, led by developer Matthew Paulus, is expected to begin next summer. In addition to the 37 affordable apartments, project plans call for 2,500 square feet of ground floor commercial space. The \$6.6 million project will take about a year to complete. Monthly rents will average around \$1,050, not including utilities.
